Lumberjack World Championships (Hayward)

See the best chopping, sawing, speed climbing, axe throwing, boom running and log rolling at the Lumberjack World Championships. Competitors from around the globe participate in this annual event honoring Wisconsin logging heritage.

Warrens Cranberry Festival (Warrens)
