With its rich historical heritage, Philadelphia is one of the United States' most visited cities.

A trip to this charming city promises ornate architecture, stately public squares like Rittenhouse and Logan, and plenty of modern-day music, food and art. Beyond Independence Hall, which went down in history as the birthplace of the Declaration of Independence, and the Liberty Bell, there are plenty of things to do in Old City, Centre City, and beyond. History buffs will enjoy a visit to the Eastern State Penitentiary, a prisonturned-museum where Al Capone was locked up.

Yet the city is far from being stuck in its glorious past. The Philly of today is filled with notable museums, a bumping nightlife, beloved sports teams and a thriving restaurant scene that encompasses more than just the ubiquitous cheesesteak.

It's a city that caters to daytime and night-time activities. You can spend the day visiting the Philadelphia Museum of Art, and the Rodin Museum and the Barnes Foundation, which has a remarkable collection of Renoirs. Then sample a cheesesteak, shop at the Italian Market, check out the funky scene along South Street, the culinary offerings at the huge Reading Terminal Market or visit one of Philadelphia's many fine restaurants. Then end the evening at one of the city's jazz bars or clubs.

Experience the Birthplace of the United States of America

Philadelphia is steeped in historical significance: In 1776, the Declaration of Independence was signed at Philadelphia's Independence Hall. After the end of the American Revolutionary War, the same room provided the backdrop for the signing of the Constitution.

A City Centre with History Around Every Corner

In Philadelphia, beautiful 18th-century homes, historic churches, and narrow, cobbled streets appear as if from nowhere, making it a great city to explore by foot. Center City and the Old City are compact and easy to get around, while the Metro puts most suburbs within easy reach

Philadelphia's dining scene is exceptional thanks to its roster of renowned chefs and restaurateurs, a wide range of ethnic and global cuisines and a festive food truck scene. Treat yourself to an unforgettable gourmet meal or try something new at Reading Terminal Market.

A Shared History


Both Brandywine and Valley Forge played noteworthy roles in the Revolutionary War: The former saw victory go to British General Howe, in the largest engagement of the Revolution, while the latter was the site of the 1777–1778 winter encampment of the Continental Army; from here emerged a spirited and rededicated fighting force. Living history villages include a revolutionary war hospital and soldier's orphan school. Sites welcome visitors to experience stories brought to life in lively and informative ways, including historical interpreters, handson demonstrations and multimedia presentations.

The Culinary Landscape

Tempting palates and satisfying cravings is a specialty in the Countryside of Philadelphia. Expert chefs transform the freshest local ingredients into the most delicious creations from haute cuisine to simple plates. Brandywine Valley's Kennett Square is affectionately called "The Mushroom Capital of the World," as over 60% of the nation's crop hails from the region. The rich terroir also produces many award-winning wines and the brewery scene is not to be missed. Valley Forge boasts over 600 restaurants and counting, satisfying many tastes and budgets. The countryside's ready access to locally sourced ingredients fuels the culinary fire that guests relish.

A Garden Paradise – Longwood Gardens

The greater Philadelphia region abounds in horticultural assets, earning the moniker "America's Garden Capital." Brandywine's world-renowned Longwood Gardens combines the best of Italian, French, and English traditions to create one of America's most memorable gardens. Longwood encompasses 1,050 acres, offering 40 indoor/outdoor gardens and a breathtaking conservatory. Longwood is also home to the most significant fountain collection in North America. The crown jewel of that collection, the Main Fountain Garden, now features over 1700 jets soaring as high as 175 feet, with amazing illuminated fountain shows seasonally.



A Shopping Haven

Bargains are just as plentiful as blooms, as fabulous shopping can be found throughout the countryside. King of Prussia Mall—the largest retail complex on the U.S. East Coast—features over 400 stores that include Neiman Marcus, Lord & Taylor, Bloomingdales and Macy's and an impressive collection of luxury retailers (Cartier, Gucci, Louis Vuitton, and Williams-Sonoma, for example). Nearby Philadelphia Premium Outlets additionally offers 150 name brand outlet stores offering 25–65 percent savings everyday from brands including Ann Taylor, Coach, Abercrombie and Fitch, Brooks Brothers and Nike. Boutiques and galleries can be found along the small towns and villages throughout the Countryside of Philadelphia. An added bonus – tax free shopping on clothing and shoes!

World-Class Museums

The Brandywine Valley & Valley Forge have museums to appeal to all tastes; from high art to lowbrow comedy. The Brandywine River Museum of Art displays an unparalleled collection of illustrations, still lifes and landscapes by three generations of the famed Wyeth

family. The Wharton Esherick Museum celebrates the "Dean of American Craftsman" and his unique and fanciful woodcarvings. The John James Audubon Center contains a copy of his Birds of America, printed and hand colored from copper plate engravings. At the other end of the spectrum, The Stoogeum stands as tribute to the comic artistry of The Three Stooges. Inside, a steady stream of their shorts plays out in an 85-seat theater, where visitors are free to sit back and giggle after viewing some 3,000 pieces of Stooge memorabilia.








Discover Lancaster County

Explore the many unique regions to be found throughout Lancaster County. Each of these regions have their own character, from downtown Lancaster to Amish and PA Dutch Countryside. You can drive to any point within Lancaster County in about an hour or less. The county is 46 miles wide at its widest point and 43 miles long at its longest point.

Lancaster County has more than 2,500 miles of winding country roads connecting small towns and villages with their inviting main streets, quirky B&Bs and charming boutiques and galleries. Lose yourself along these back roads as you're transported to another time, among breathtakingly scenic farmlands, romantic covered bridges and Amish life.

Lancaster County is home to America's oldest Amish settlement, where thousands still live a centuries-old "plain" lifestyle. It's a place where visitors can step back in time to enjoy a slower, more peaceful pace – where the horse and buggy remains a primary form of transportation, and where windmills dot the landscape, providing a nature-harnessed power source.







Discover Hershey & Harrisburg

Hershey is the perfect place for sweet family fun. Harrisburg is the capital city with a small-town feel. It's one town, one city, and everything in between that makes this destination unique and gives everyone something to enjoy.

With hundreds of ales, lagers, and stouts to try, the Region is speckled with small batch craft beer startups who are following their dream and creating trendy, welcoming spaces for beer lovers to appreciate their favorite draughts. From Troegs Independent Brewing, one of the most recognized craft beer names in the Mid Atlantic Region, to the dozen more breweries throughout the region, there is plenty of craft culture to explore. If wine is more to your liking, there are 20 vineyards and wineries that invite guests to go beyond tasting, to learn about the process behind each winery's whites, reds, blends, ciders, and seasonal selections. Or take a swig of handcrafted spirits and sample a moonshine cocktail at one of the budding distilleries that are popping up around the region. Harrisburg's downtown is a great escape for food with menus filled with seasonal selections made with just-harvested ingredients from surrounding farms. Restaurants buzz on warm nights when outdoor, riverfront and rooftop dining are the spots to be.


Day 4 Philadelphia to Valley Forge (25 miles)

Raise a Glass


